The Work

The Results

The CPDS developed by ENKON serves the needs of the SCC and conservation districts by simplifying the processes needed to provide voluntary, incentive-based programs that empower private landowners to implement conservation on their properties. The SCC and its partner organizations connect to a single system of record that tracks landowner participation and monitors the effectiveness of programs across all of Washington's 45 conservation districts.
